"Workforce First Act" (HSB 50, HF 420, SSB 1024)

Excerpts from the previously proposed legislation <u>HF420</u>:

- "No later than...November 1, 2025, the board shall complete a review of all undergraduate and graduate academic programs ...to determine whether and to what extent each academic program aligns with current and future workforce needs in this state.
- "For each academic program reviewed, the report shall recommend that the program remain unchanged, recommend that the program be eliminated, or recommend that the program be changed and describe recommended changes."



Workforce Alignment Review of Programs

Alternatively...

- Iowa BOR will conduct a Workforce Alignment Review (WAR) of Programs by Oct 15, 2025
- Developed in collaboration with academic leaders and Board office staff and rely on publicly available common data sets
- Focus on for-credit undergraduate, graduate and professional academic programs



Workforce Alignment Review of Programs

The BOR report will include:

- Workforce alignment data by program (i.e. <u>PSEO Explorer Census Bureau</u>)
- Wages and job projections (Iowa Workforce Development, Bureau of Labor Statistics)
- ROI for program graduates (i.e <u>Explore Our ROI Rankings CEW Georgetown</u>)
- Average number of program graduates (i.e graduation numbers at 4- & 6-digit CIP; professional licensure outcomes)
- Recommendations

Final report will be presented to the Board at the November 2025 meeting



Workforce Alignment Review of Programs

FAQ's

Defining "programs"

Focus is currently on using 4 digit CIP (classification of instructional programs) codes and federal labels related to "field of study" (see <u>BOR list for all 3 institutions</u>)

• Note how certain 6 digit CIPs roll up into a larger "field of study"

Data sources

Focus on public data sources <u>PSEO Explorer - Census Bureau</u>

BOR staff continues to explore ROI methodology <u>Explore Our ROI Rankings - CEW Georgetown</u>

Next Steps

• BOR staff and WAR Council

- Develop a mock-up of a 1-pager for each program to start to conceptualize final output
- Meetings with Iowa Workforce Development, Iowa Department of Education, and Iowa Business Council to identify additional data sources
- Continue development of program-level ROI methodology
- Create data dictionary
- UNI
 - Watch for updates throughout the summer
 - Consider curriculum changes and innovation through the lens of workforce development and enrollment growth
